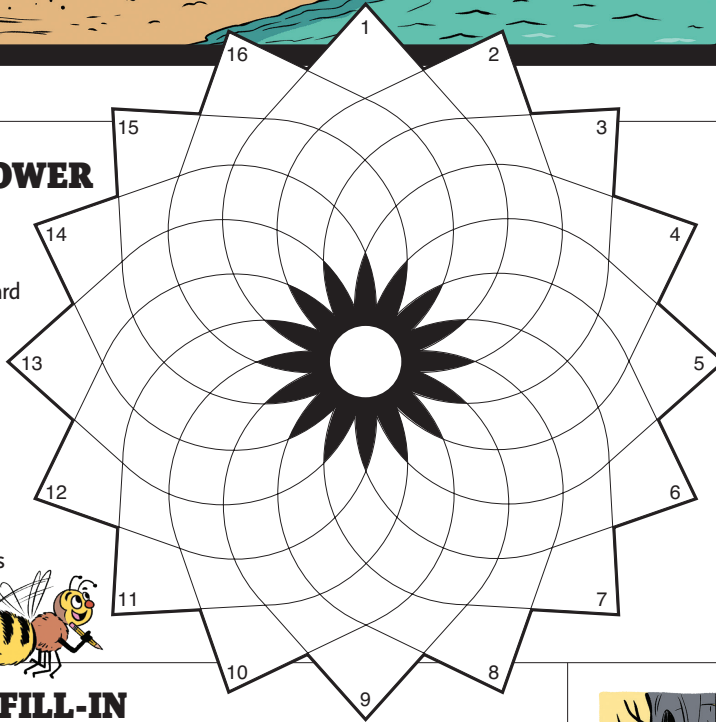

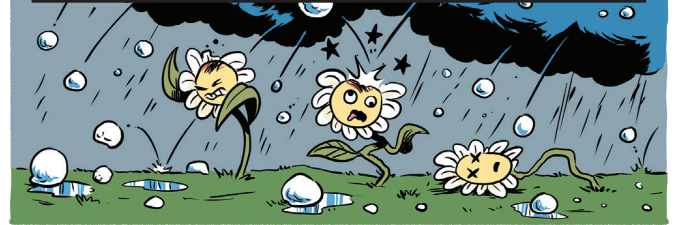

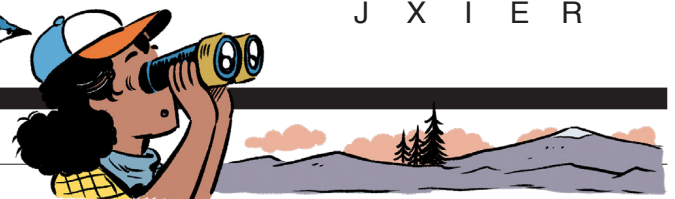

TREASURES

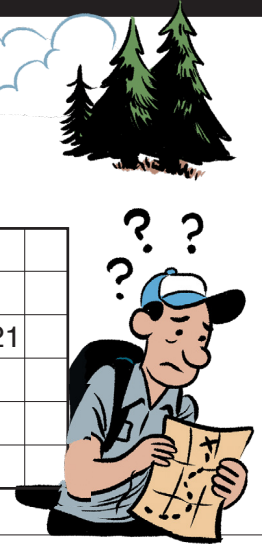
